




#### **Collaboration & International Scope**

#### **Supporting the Trust**

The Clandon Park staff and volunteers already have absorbed and enthusiastically passed on what they know of the fire, its causes, the salvage, rescue, survey and archaeology. Additionally, Adrian Paye is a skills assessor for the Queen Elizabeth Scholarship Trust.

The consultant team are looking forward to helping the National Trust showcase it's roots, causes, philosophy, and conservation ethos made plain through the new character of Clandon Park:

- a classical built geometry in a romantic asymmetrical topography

#### Gensler's experience includes:

- As a part of the City of London's Vision 2050 programme, Gensler organised and ran a stakeholder engagement workshop on what Resilience means for the City of London.

#### CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

We do not think there is an inherent conflict of interest between our team and the client, nor indeed between the team members themselves.

The Fire Brigade reports the fire started in the back of an electrical panel which could not have been identified by diligent inspection, we are aware that the fire investigations for Clandon Park encompass basement electrical work specified, inspected and certified by Martin Thomas Associates. However, MTA have a long track record and term appointment with the Trust. They work with many sectors, including the Church and the Charity sector, where integrity is a significant element in client relationships. They have worked on reconstruction of fire-damaged properties for the Trust and others, including Uppark.

MTA have records for Clandon Park from a number of environmental monitoring systems installed before the fire. We therefore believe MTA are very well placed to analyse and advise how closely the new services might approximate to the 'domestic' scale of the pre-fire servicing, without over-loading the internal conditions with complex controls or building management systems.
